

Speaker 1: Governor Newsom has announced how the coronavirus vaccine will be distributed here in California once it does officially arrived, and more importantly, be approved before that. 327,000 doses of that Pfizer vaccine will potentially arrive within the next couple of weeks. It will be distributed across three tiers of the state. The first tier, psychiatric correctional, and skilled nursing facilities. The second, private and public health care facilities. And the third tier is specialty clinics and lab workers, which includes dental clinics and pharmacy staff.
